## Screening Procedure For Potential Impacts To Wetlands - Erosion and Sediment Control Land Treatment and Streambank Stabilization Project

Per the Interagency Wetlands Policy Act and the Illinois Department of Agriculture's Wetland Action Plan, the below guidance is provided to SWCDs regarding potential impacts to wetlands by projects that exceed \$10,000 in total cost. The entire screening and coordination process must be completed prior to construction of those specific erosion and sediment control land treatment and streambank stabilization projects.

- A. Inventory all projects approved by the SWCD Board, which will be more than \$10,000 in cost-share, on a per project basis.
- B. Conduct a site visit of those specific projects and complete the wetland site screening form provided by the IDOA.
- **C.** Send the completed wetland screening form to the Bureau of Land and Water Resources as soon as possible.
- **D.** Upon receipt of the completed site screening form, the IDOA, in cooperation with the SWCD, will determine whether a formal wetland determination will be necessary. If a formal delineation is needed, the IDOA will work with the SWCD to secure such delineation.
- E. If the screening process and subsequent formal wetland delineation reveal that the proposed project will indeed impact a wetland, coordinate with the land user to avoid or reduce the anticipated impact, after consultation with the IDOA.
- F. Assist the IDOA in developing wetland impact and mitigation information that will be forwarded to the Illinois Department of Natural Resources for review.
- **G.** Document discussions with the land user to avoid or reduce impacts to wetlands with the project and send a copy to the IDOA.
- H. Do not fund projects where they will negatively impact wetlands without appropriate mitigation for such impacts, as coordinated with the IDOA.

**NOTE:** For those SSRP projects (beyond \$10,000 cost-share) that may impact wetlands, only a portion of the SSRP project area may qualify as a jurisdictional wetland. Specifically, that limited area is the shelf at the toe of a slope in the streambed, just above the stream channel. If that shelf area contains wetland vegetation, depending upon its width, then that area may be a wetland. For further clarification, the streambank itself (particularly if it's not eroding) and the stream itself are not wetlands.
