## CALENDAR YEAR \_\_\_\_\_ (January 1st - December 31st) VEGETATIVE FILTER STRIP ASSESSMENT REPORT

Public Act 89-606, the Vegetative Filter Strip Assessment Law, was enacted by the General Assembly on January 1, 1997. The law was extended to December 31, 2026 under Public Act 94-1002 in 2006. Under the law, qualifying property used as a vegetative filter strip is eligible to be assessed at a reduced rate. Soil and Water Conservation Districts have been given the authority for certifying that a parcel of property meets the requirements for a vegetative filter strip established under the law, and for determining the size of the vegetative filter strip. Also, the law requires the Department of Agriculture and the Department of Natural Resources to prepare a joint report concerning the effect and impact of the vegetative filter strip assessment law and submit it to the General Assembly.
